Nathan presented a copy of the annual report for review. Suggestions were made for additions.

The Meredith Energy Committee is holding an Energy Fair on Jan. 15 which is of interest to the committee.

The report, Energy Efficiency Opportunities for the Town Buildings Bristol, NH, prepared by the Peregrine Energy Group and Breakaway Energy Services was reviewed. The committee selected items that would be least labor intensive and could be covered by existing maintenance funds to focus on at this time. A list was generated and Nathan and Michelle will make contacts to encourage these improvements. On the list were, winterizing the Old Town Hall and shutting off the heat. In the town office building items to be addressed are changing the light bulbs and fixtures if necessary and replacing exit lights to more efficient ones and replacing the water heater in the newer part of the building and wrapping hot water pipes. Larger projects will be addressed at another meeting.

Lucille suggested we ask the Selectmen to create a budget line for this committee in order for us to ask for funds next year. Michelle reported that Michael Capone would be bringing up the idea of a No Idling Policy for town vehicles at this weeks Selectboard meeting.

Nathan will see Mark Bucklin and present him with the Hero of Conservation Award.
